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Pasco County Administrator of the Year

Daniela Bruno

Office for Leading and Learning MTSS Specialist

Ms. Daniela Bruno started her career in Pasco County 18 years ago as a teacher at Gulf Middle School. She quickly rose as a teacher



leader and transitioned into an instructional trainer coach where she supported teachers in planning and facilitating high quality lessons. In 2017, Ms. Bruno joined the Office for Leading and Learning as an ELA Curriculum Specialist where she supported several elementary schools in the development of strong literacy systems that focused on high levels of learning for each one of our students.

Most currently, Ms. Bruno serves as one of the Elementary MTSS Specialists. She partners with school leaders, district curriculum specialists and instructional coaches to ensure schools have strong systems to support the learning for all. Pasco County Assistant Principal of the Year

Jill Cortier J. W. Mitchell High School Assistant Principal

Ms. Jill Cortier began her journey with Pasco County Schools in 2007 as a Science Teacher at J.W. Mitchell High School, where she taught Integrated Science and Biology for three years.



While teaching, Ms. Cortier was instrumental in rewriting the Pasco School District curriculum maps for Integrated Science. She also served as the committee chair for the formation and implementation of Mustang University – Ninth Grade Academy.

In July of 2010, Ms. Cortier was promoted to Assistant Principal at J.W. Mitchell High School. She is a valued leader who takes decisive action to improve teaching, learning, and student success. Not only does she oversee the school counselors and academic advisors, but she also develops the school's master schedule. Ms. Cortier ensures all students and families are well informed of each opportunity available to them. She conducts classroom walkthroughs and supports teachers' professional development and the evaluation process. She monitors PLC (Professional Learning Community) groups, coordinates quarterly data chats, and participates with other school leaders on the district-level Secondary Design Team. Ms. Cortier also coordinates the Extended School Year remediation program.

Christopher Dunning Wendell Krinn Technical High School Principal

Dr. Chris Dunning has been an educator in Pasco County for over 30 years. He started his career as an elementary school teacher and quickly advanced to elementary Assistant



Principal and then Principal. He also spent time as the district's Chief Negotiator in the Office for Employee Relations.

Dr. Dunning was selected to open Paul R. Smith Middle School, where he led his team to become the highest-scoring Title I School in the district. Following this, he went to Seven Springs Middle School and led them to become the highest-scoring school in the entire district. Given his successes, Dr. Dunning was asked to move to our only double "D" high school and in just one year, his leadership assisted the school in raising their grade and getting them off the state watch list. Currently, he is the Principal at Wendell Krinn Technical High School, the district's first magnet high school that has been recognized as a Demonstration Magnet School and provides opportunities for students in 14 career areas.

LeAnne John Zephyrhills High School Agriculture Teacher

After growing up showing animals in 4H and FFA (Future Farmers of America) and graduating from the University of South Florida, Leanne John



began her Pasco County career at West Zephyrhills Elementary School and served students there for 14 years. In 2017, she decided to combine her love for 4H, agriculture, and Pasco County Junior Cattlemen by accepting the agriculture instructor position at Zephyrhills High School.

When Ms. John took over the school's Agriculture Program it had around 90 students. Leanne realized that the FFA program needed new life and created three main goals: to grow student enrollment with enough consistency to earn a second AG teacher allocation, to have students winning awards on a National Stage within 5 years, and to create a Junior FFA chapter. Leanne achieved all of those goals within 3 years! Under her guidance, the Zephyrhills FFA program has grown to over 200 students, has two instructors, and earned National Chapter 2 Star recognition.

Leanne also serves as a Mentor Teacher and as the District Career, Technical, and Adult Education PLC (Professional Learning Community) Lead for Agriculture. She was selected to participate in the Agriscience Educational Leadership Program in the 22-23 school year, and her passion for helping students grow into leaders in the Zephyrhills and agriculture communities is evident in the activities, events, and challenges she incorporates into her lessons and student experiences. She has created a leadership standard that her students carry forward when working with new and younger students. The culture and climate she has created in her classroom, lab, and barn encourage students to be creative problemsolvers and incorporates critical thinking with real-world applications.
